

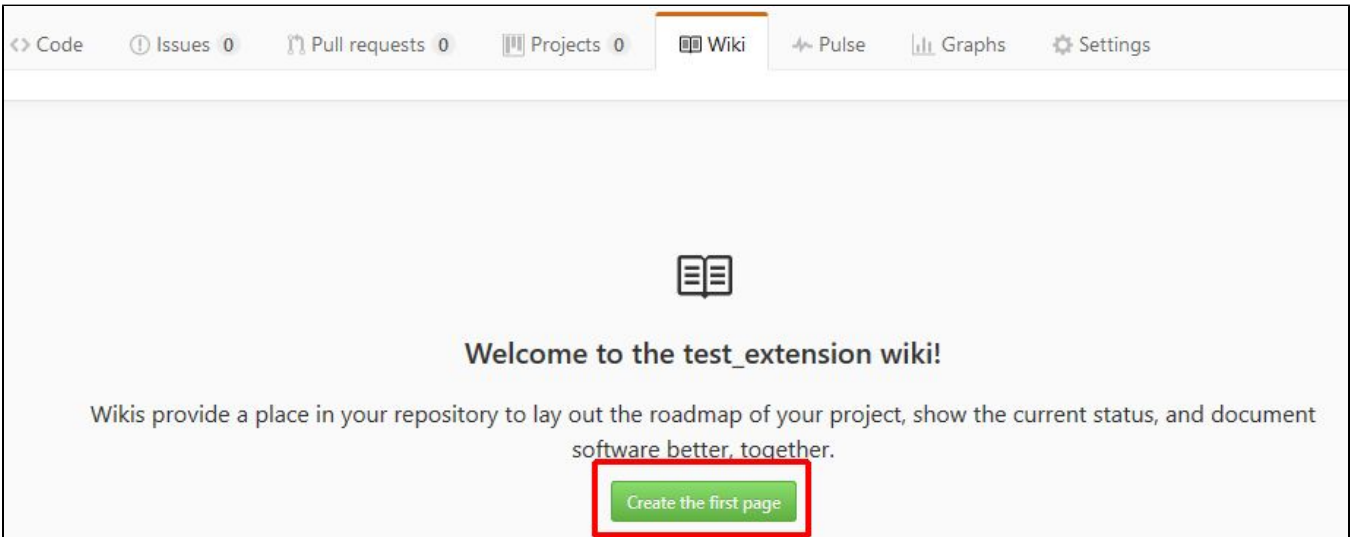
# How to publish documentation for CAST User Community extensions

**Summary:** Any CAST User Community extension (i.e. a custom extension) requires documentation that is freely available on the internet. CAST highly recommends creating the documentation within the **GitHub repository** you are using for the source code. This page describes the steps required to publish documentation in GitHub.

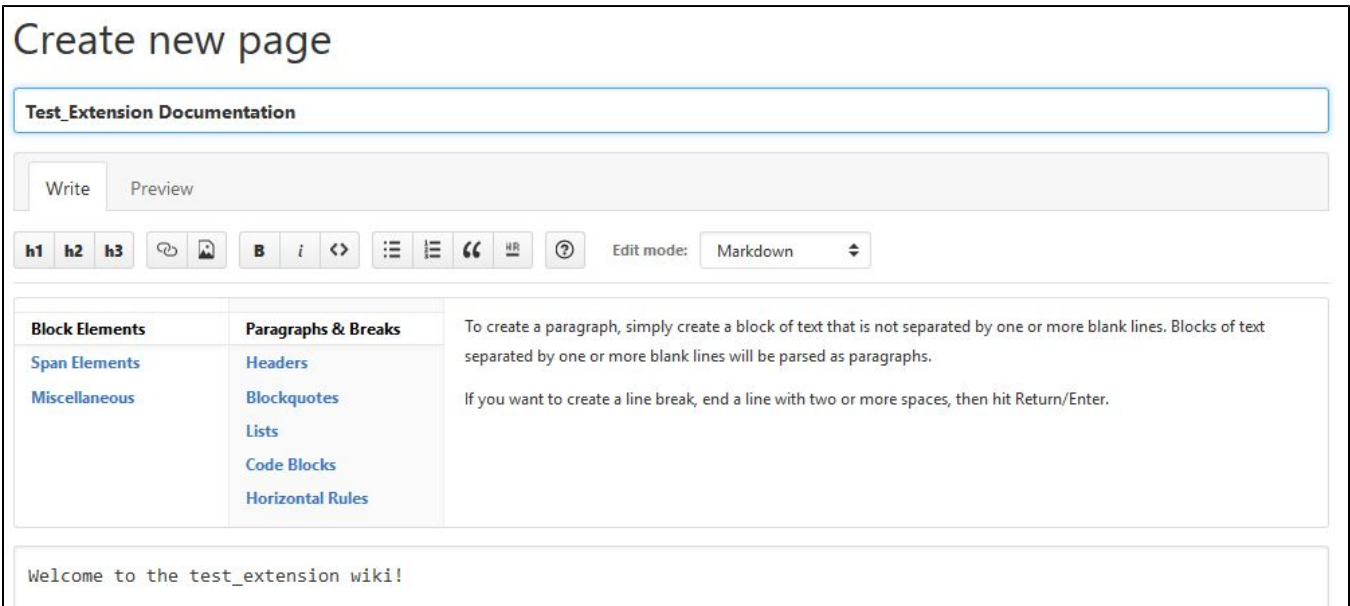
- In the **GitHub repository** (see [Prerequisites and top-tips for creating a custom extension](#) for more information about this) you are using to store the custom extension's source code, click the **Wiki** tab:



- Create a **new page** that will contain the extension documentation:



- Change the title of the page:
